SUNDAY EPISTLE: *1 Peter 4:7-11*

Dearly beloved, be prudent and watch in prayers. But before all things have a constant mutual charity among yourselves: for charity covereth a multitude of sins. Using hospitality one towards another, without murmuring: as every man hath received grace, ministering the same one to another, as good stewards of the manifold grace of God. If any man speak, let him speak as the words of God: if any minister, let him do it, as of the power which God administereth: that in all things God may be honored through Jesus Christ our Lord.

SUNDAY GOSPEL: *John 15:26-27; 16:1-4*

At that time, Jesus said to His disciples: When the Paraclete cometh, Whom I will send you from the Father, the Spirit of truth, Who proceedeth from the Father, He shall give testimony of Me: and you shall give testimony because you are with Me from the beginning. These things have I spoken to you, that you may not be scandalized. They will put you out of the synagogues: yea, the hour cometh, that whosoever killeth you will think that he doth a service to God. And these things will they do to you, because they have not known the Father, nor Me. But these things I have told you, that, when the hour shall come, you may remember that I told you of them.

For your continued growth in holiness and piety, we encourage you to attend Mass during the week.

◊ **Note from the Pastor:** "Before all things have a constant mutual charity among yourselves: for charity covereth a multitude of sins. Using hospitality one towards another, without murmuring." These are beautiful words from the first letter of St. Peter assigned for today's epistle. St. Thomas Aquinas further explains that charity with our neighbor is an absolute "requirement" for happiness. And Our Lord in St. Luke's Gospel says "If you only love those who love you, what credit is that to you? For even sinners do the same." Let us continue to work towards peace in our families and community above all by practicing charity with one another. For only by practicing this virtue will we find happiness and peace. God reward you.

◊ **High Mass Responses:** At all High Masses, the congregation is invited and encouraged to join in the chanted responses such as "Et cum spiritu tuo" and "Amen," as well as hymns and other parts of the Mass as announced on the hymn board and in the bulletin. Some chants are normally sung in alternation between the schola and congregation; please do not join in the a cappella parts, which should be sung by the schola alone. The congregation also sings the seasonal Marian antiphon after the 8:00 AM Sunday Mass.

◊ **Low Mass Responses:** It is not customary at Mater Misericordiae for the faithful to make any spoken responses during the Mass. Please allow the altar servers alone to make the responses.

◊ **Communion on the Tongue:** Please remember that when you are receiving Communion, you must kneel, if able, tilt your head back slightly, close your eyes, and extend your tongue. You do not say "Amen" afterwards.
