SUNDAY EPISTLE: *Jas. 1:17-21*

Dearly beloved, every best gift and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of Lights, with Whom there is no change nor shadow of alteration. For of His own will hath He begotten us by the word of truth, that we might be some beginning of His creature. You know, my dearest brethren. And let every man be swift to hear, but slow to speak and slow to anger. For the anger of man worketh not the justice of God. Wherefore, casting away all uncleanness and abundance of naughtiness, with meekness receive the ingrafted word, which is able to save your souls.

SUNDAY GOSPEL: *John 16. 5-14*

At that time Jesus said to His disciples: "I go to Him that sent Me: and none of you asketh Me: Whither goest thou? But because I have spoken these things to you, sorrow hath filled your heart. But I tell you the truth: it is expedient to you that I go, for if I go not, the Paraclete will not come to you: but if I go, I will send Him to you. And when He is come, He will convince the world of sin and of justice and of judgment. Of sin, because they believed not in Me. And of justice: because I go to the Father, and you shall see Me no longer. And of judgment, because the prince of this world is already judged. I have yet many things to say to you; but you cannot bear them now. But when He, the Spirit of truth, is come, He will teach you all truth. For He shall not speak of Himself: but what things soever He shall hear, He shall speak. And the things that are to come, He shall show you. He shall glorify Me: because He shall receive of Mine and shall show it to you.

For your continued growth in holiness and piety, we encourage you to attend Mass during the week.

◊ **High Mass Responses:** At all High Masses, the congregation is invited and encouraged to join in the chanted responses such as "Et cum spiritu tuo" and "Amen," as well as hymns and other parts of the Mass as announced on the hymn board and in the bulletin. Some chants are normally sung in alternation between the schola and congregation; please do not join in the a cappella parts, which should be sung by the schola alone. The congregation also sings the seasonal Marian antiphon after the 8 AM and 12:30 PM Sunday Masses. Response: *Quia surrexit Dominus vere, allelúia.*

◊ **Low Mass Responses:** It is not customary at Mater Misericordiae for the faithful to make any spoken responses during the Mass. Please allow the altar servers alone to make the responses.

◊ **Communion on the Tongue:** Please remember that when receiving Communion you must tilt your head back slightly, close your eyes, and extend your tongue. You do not say "Amen" afterwards.

◊ **Assistant Pastor's Note:** It is a custom in many FSSP parishes to offer confessions on Sundays before Holy Masses. The faithful here at Mater Misericordiae Mission are encouraged to go to confession frequently but we would like that as far as you are able, to attend our many available times for confession during the week and especially on Saturdays from 2:00 PM to 3:00 PM. There are long lines in our small, crowded church on Sundays. There is something important to remember: Sunday is a day to assist devoutly at the Holy Mass. One should follow the Mass with the Missal and listening to the sermon. Additionally, venial sins are forgiven when we devoutly use Holy water and when you recite the *Confiteor* at the penitential rite of Mass. If you set aside a time to go to confession during the week, it will help you to do a good examination of conscience and to have a serious purpose of amendment. "Without a regular examination of conscience we never get to know our faults properly. Rather, they increase evil inclinations and inordinate passions become stronger and may seriously threaten the life of grace" (*Frequent Confession* by Benedict Baur).
