SUNDAY EPISTLE: Acts. 2:1-11

When the days of the Pentecost were accomplished, they were all together in one place: And suddenly there came a sound from heaven, as of a mighty wind coming: and it filled the whole house where they were sitting. And there appeared to them parted tongues, as it were of fire: and it sat upon every one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Ghost: and they began to speak with divers tongues, according as the Holy Ghost gave them to speak. Now there were dwelling at Jerusalem, Jews, devout men, out of every nation under heaven. And when this was noised abroad, the multitude came together, and were confounded in mind, because that every man heard them speak in his own tongue. And they were all amazed, and wondered, saying: Behold, are not all these that speak Galilean? And how have we heard, every man our own tongue wherein we were born? Parthians and Medes and Elamites and inhabitants of Mesopotamia, Judea, and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya about Cyrene, and strangers of Rome, Jews also, and proselytes, Cretes, and Arabians: we have heard them speak in our own tongues the wonderful works of God.

SUNDAY GOSPEL: John 14:23-31

At that time, Jesus answered and said to him: If any one love Me, he will keep My word. And My Father will love him and We will come to him and will make Our abode with him. He that loveth Me not keepeth not My words. And the word which you have heard is not Mine; but the Father's Who sent Me. These things have I spoken to you, abiding with you. But the Paraclete, the Holy Ghost, Whom the Father will send in My name, He will teach you all things and bring all things to your mind, whatsoever I shall have said to you. Peace I leave with you, My peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, do I give unto you. Let not your heart be troubled: nor let it be afraid. You have heard that I said to you: I go away, and I come unto you. If you loved Me you would indeed be glad, because I go to the Father: for the Father is greater than I. And now I have told you before it come to pass: that when it shall come to pass, you may believe. I will not now speak many things with you. For the prince of this world: cometh: and in Me he hath not any thing. But that the world may know that I love the Father: and as the Father hath given Me commandments, so do I.

◊ **Note from the Pastor:** I was happy to announce last week that we have come into an agreement with the Diocese of Phoenix for the acquisition of St. Edward's Catholic Church which is located at 48th St. and Southern. I am most excited at the fact that this property sits on nearly five acres of land which will afford us the opportunity to grow and to plan for the future. The end goal is to one day build a magnificent church, suitable to accommodate our growing community. We have received a generous donation of \$100K from, fellow parishioner, Mrs. Kathryn Flynn in memory of her late husband, Mr. Don Flynn. Please pray for them. This donation will help us begin renovation on the existing church immediately. I am happy to announce as well that Fr. Terra, who is responsible for the design and construction of the sanctuary of our current church, will be returning to Phoenix to help us design and construct the altar of the church currently on St. Edward's property. Furthermore, Bishop Olmsted has asked that we maintain our current location; Mater Misericordiæ, which I know many of you are happy to do, including myself. There is much more to be said regarding the takeover, and it need not be said that much work will be expected of all of us, but for now, let us give thanks to Our Lord, especially the Divine Infant of Prague, for His benevolence and care of our community. May He forever be praised and blessed.

◊ **High Mass Responses:** At all High Masses, the congregation is invited and encouraged to join in the chanted responses such as "Et cum spiritu tuo" and "Amen," as well as hymns and other parts of the Mass as announced on the hymn board and in the bulletin. Some chants are normally sung in alternation between the schola and congregation; please do not join in the a cappella parts, which should be sung by the schola alone. The congregation also sings the seasonal Marian antiphon after the 8:00 AM Sunday Mass.

◊ **Partial Indulgence:** A partial indulgence is granted to the faithful who devoutly recite the hymn *Veni Creator Spiritus* (p. 542). On the feast of Pentecost, a plenary indulgence is granted on the usual conditions if the hymn is recited publicly. To gain an indulgence it is sufficient to recite the prayer alternately with a companion or to follow it mentally while it is recited by another (1999 *Manual of Indulgences*, norm 23).

◊ **First Friday:** Our next First Friday Mass, June 4th, we will have a Solemn High Mass in honor of the most Sacred Heart of Jesus, celebrated by the Franciscan Friars of the Holy Spirit, and followed by the normal Holy Hour afterwards. Join us!

◊ **Rosary Before Mass:** Beginning this Sunday, the Rosary will be recited at 10 AM each Sunday until religious education classes resume. Please be considerate and avoid making unnecessary noise in the hall when the choirs are rehearsing.
