## COLLECT

### SUNDAY EPISTLE: *Eph. 4. 23-28*

Brethren: Be ye renewed in the spirit of your mind, and put on the new man, who according to God is created in justice and holiness of truth. Wherefore, putting away lying, speak ye the truth every man with his neighbour, for we are members one of another. Be angry, and sin not. Let not the sun go down upon your anger. Give not place to the devil. He that stole, let him now steal no more: but rather let him labour, working with his hands the thing which is good, that he may have something to give to him that suffereth need.

### SUNDAY GOSPEL: *Matthew 22. 1-14*

At that time: Jesus spoke to the chief priests and the Pharisees in parables, saying: The kingdom of heaven is likened to a king, who made a marriage for his son; and he sent his servants, to call them that were invited to the marriage, and they would not come. Again he sent other servants, saying: Tell them that were invited: Behold, I have prepared my dinner; my beeves and fatlings are killed, and all things are ready; come ye to the marriage. But they neglected: and went their ways, one to his farm, and another to his merchandise; and the rest laid hands on his servants, and having treated them contumeliously, put them to death. But when the king had heard of it, he was angry; and sending his armies, he destroyed those murderers, and burnt their city. Then he saith to his servants: The marriage indeed is ready, but they that were invited were not worthy. Go ye therefore into the highways, and as many as you shall find, call to the marriage. And his servants going forth into the ways, gathered together all that they found, both bad and good; and the marriage was filled with guests. And the king went in to see the guests; and he saw there a man who had not a wedding garment: and he saith to him: Friend, how camest thou in hither, not having on a wedding garment? but he was silent. Then the king said to the waiters: Bind his hands and feet, and cast him into the exterior darkness: there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth. For many are called, but few are chosen.

◊ **Note from the Pastor:** St. Paul tells us in Romans 5:3 not to be afraid of suffering but rather to rejoice. *"Rejoice in your suffering for suffering produces endurance and endurance produces hope."* Suffering is necessary to build endurance whether in the physical or spiritual. A week from tomorrow (Oct. 11) I'll be running in the 125<sup>th</sup> Boston Marathon which has taken a lot of discipline as well as suffering mile after mile to qualify. A marathon runner must get used to the pain and try to relax his body to endure the 26-mile distance. So, it is in the spiritual life as well. One must get use to the trials, crosses, and difficulties to endure but in enduring trial after trial, while still standing, it gives the soul increased confidence in God's love and hope for the future. I feel the training has done much good for me spiritually, so it will be a great joy for me on multiple levels, to reach the starting line, run the race, and then spend a little vacation time with my parents in New York City. God is good. I will not leave you orphans, however. The priest who will be filling in for me next weekend is Fr. John Brancich, F.S.S.P. He was Pastor for many years in my hometown parish and as my spiritual director, was responsible in getting me to the Seminary. Please give him a warm welcome should you have the opportunity and pray that I run fast in Boston! God reward you.

◊ **Question of the Week:** Is it wrong or not a good idea if someone in a family baptizes someone else in the families child with the intent to pray for that child and that child's formation?

The Church teaches that the infant who receives Baptism needs to be brought up nurtured and educated in the catholic faith with the assistance of godparents. Therefore, if such conditions are not fulfilled then you cannot licitly baptize a child. The baptism is to be delayed according to the prescripts of particular law after the parents have been advised about the reason. Baptism is the sacrament of initiation in the faith so it means that you will have to prepare to receive the other sacraments such as Confirmation, Penance and Holy Communion. The Code of canon law which is the law of the Church explains this as follows:

**Can. 868** §1. For an infant to be baptized licitly:

1/ the parents or at least one of them or the person who legitimately takes their place must consent;  
2/ There must be a founded hope that the infant will be brought up in the Catholic religion; if such hope is altogether lacking, the baptism is to be delayed according to the prescripts of particular law after the parents have been advised about the reason.

§2. An infant of Catholic parents or even of non-Catholic parents is baptized licitly in danger of death even against the will of the parents.


