SUNDAY EPISTLE: Eph. 5:15-21

Brethren: See how you walk circumspectly, not as unwise but as wise; redeeming the time, because the days are evil. Wherefore, become not unwise, but understanding what is the will of God. And be not drunk with wine, wherein is luxury: but be ye filled with the Holy Ghost, speaking to yourselves in psalms and hymns and spiritual canticles, singing and making melody in your hearts to the Lord: giving thanks always for all things, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, to God and the Father; being subject one to another in the fear of Christ.

SUNDAY GOSPEL: Jn. 4:46-53

At that time, there was a certain ruler whose son was sick at Capharnaum. He having heard that Jesus was come from Judea into Galilee, went to Him, and prayed Him to come down and heal his son; for he was at the point of death. Jesus therefore said to him: Unless you see signs and wonders, you believe not. The ruler saith to Him: Lord, come down before my child die. Jesus saith to him: Go thy way, your son liveth. The man believed the word which Jesus said to him, and went his way. And as he was going down, his servants met him, and they brought word, saying that his son lived. He asked of them therefore the hour in which he had got better. And they told him: Yesterday at the seventh hour, the fever left him. The father knew then that it was at that very hour in which Jesus had said to him: Thy son liveth; and himself believed, and his whole house.

On All Souls' Day, Nov. 2, a plenary indulgence, applicable only to the Poor Souls, is granted to those who visit any parish church or public oratory and there recite one Our Father and one Apostles' Creed.

In order to gain a plenary indulgence one must: (1) be in a state of Sanctifying Grace, (2) complete the indulgenced work, (3) have no attachment to sin, not even venial sin, (4) receive is Ecclesiastical Hierarchy & Scripture in the Early Church.
