SUNDAY COLLECT

Almighty and everlasting God, Who hast enabled us to honor in one solemn feast the merits of all Thy Saints: we beseech Thee, that, with so many praying for us, Thou wouldst pour forth on us the abundance of Thy mercy for which we long. Through our Lord.

SUNDAY EPISTLE: Apoc. 7:2-12

In those days, behold, I, John, saw another Angel ascending from the rising of the sun, having the sign of the living God. And he cried with a loud voice to the four Angels to whom it was given to hurt the earth and the sea, saying: Hurt not the earth nor the sea nor the trees, till we sign the servants of our God in their foreheads. And I heard the number of them that were signed: an hundred forty-four thousand were signed, of every tribe of the children of Israel. Of the tribe of Juda, were twelve thousand signed: of the tribe of Ruben, twelve thousand signed: of the tribe of Gad, twelve thousand signed: of the tribe of Aser twelve thousand signed: of the tribe of Nephthali, twelve thousand signed: of the tribe of Manasses twelve thousand signed: of the tribe of Simeon twelve thousand signed: of the tribe of Levi twelve thousand signed: of the tribe of Issachar twelve thousand signed: of the tribe of Zabulon twelve thousand signed: of the tribe of Joseph, twelve thousand signed: of the tribe of Benjamin twelve thousand signed. After this, I saw a great multitude, which no man could number, of all nations and tribes and peoples and tongues, standing before the throne and in sight of the Lamb, clothed with white robes, and palms in their hands; and they cried with a loud voice, saying: Salvation to our God, Who sitteth upon the throne and to the Lamb. And all the Angels stood round about the throne and the ancients and the four living creatures; and they fell down before the throne upon their faces and adored God, saying: Amen. Benediction, and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving, honor and power and strength, to our God, for ever and ever. Amen.

SUNDAY GOSPEL: Mt. 5:1-12

At that time, Jesus, seeing the multitudes, went up into a mountain, and when He was set down, His disciples came unto Him. And opening His mouth, He taught them, saying: Blessed are the poor in spirit; for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are the meek; for they shall possess the land. Blessed are they that mourn; for they shall be comforted. Blessed are they that hunger and thirst after justice: for they shall have their fill. Blessed are the merciful, for they shall obtain mercy. Blessed are the clean of heart; for they shall see God. Blessed are the peacemakers; for they shall be called the children of God. Blessed are they that suffer persecution for justice' sake; for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are ye when they shall revile you, and persecute you, and speak all that is evil against you, untruly, for My sake: be glad and rejoice for your reward is very great in heaven.

♦ **Diocesan Priest:** Fr. Fernando Camou will be helping us with Masses on Sunday, November 8. Please be sure to extend a warm Mater Misericordiae greeting to Father and thank him for his help.

♦ **All Souls Day:** On Monday, November 2, Fr. Passo will be offering the 6:30am Low Mass followed by two consecutive Low Masses. There will be no Holy Hour that morning. Fr. Rock will offer the 6:30pm High Mass followed by two consecutive Low Masses. We invite you to join us that day to pray for the faithful departed. The Holy Souls in Purgatory count on our charity and prayers.

♦ **Plenary Indulgence:** November is the month of the Holy Souls. This year the Major Penitentiary has decreed that instead of being limited to November 1-8, the faithful can transfer the possibility of achieving indulgences for the faithful departed to any particular day during the whole month of November, for the same total of eight days, but not necessarily contiguous days. A plenary indulgence is granted to those who visit a cemetery and pray, even if only mentally, for the departed.

On the same days, partial indulgences, which can be offered for the Poor Souls, are granted to those who recite Lauds or Vespers of the Office of the Dead, and to those who recite the prayer: "Requiem aeternam dona eis, Domine, et lux perpetua luceat eis. Requiescant in pace. / Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace."

On All Souls' Day, November 2, a plenary indulgence, applicable only to the Poor Souls, is granted to those who visit any parish church or public oratory and there recite one Our Father and one Apostles' Creed.

In order to gain a plenary indulgence one must: (1) be in a state of Sanctifying Grace, (2) complete the indulgenced work, (3) have no attachment to sin, not even venial sin, (4) receive Sacramental Confession, (5) receive Eucharistic Communion, (6) pray for the Pope's Intentions (one Our Father and one Hail Mary satisfy this requirement). Points 4, 5, and 6 should appropriately be done on the same day as the indulgenced work, but may be done up to about 20 days before or after. A separate Communion and prayer for the Holy Father's intentions are required for each plenary indulgence. Normally, only one plenary indulgence can be obtained each day.
